Re: Suspects arrested in Daytime Burglaries

On July 8th, 2010, Hernando County Detectives arrested Jason Vanderbilt and Roy Todd in connection to four daytime burglaries in the Spring Hill area.

Shortly after 1400 hours on July 8th, the Sheriff's Office received a call in reference to two subjects entering a residence at 5252 Mosquero Road in Spring Hill. Deputies arrived on scene and found a white Honda parked across the street from this residence. A check on the vehicle revealed the registered owner was Johnathan Vanderbilt. Deputies observed a flat screen television and .22 caliber ammunition in plain view, inside the vehicle.

Deputies set up a perimeter around the area and Coordinator W. Martinez with his K-9, Kevlar, were called to the scene to assist in tracking the suspects. The two suspects were apprehended by the K-9 team, hiding in the screen room of 4217 Drummond Avenue. Both were taken into custody without incident.

Upon interviewing the subjects, both confessed to committing burglaries at 9563 Langan Street, 2124 Deborah Drive and 5252 Mosquero Road. Vanderbilt and Todd were arrested and subsequently charged with:

- 2 counts of Burglary (Langan, Mosquero)
- 1 count of Occupied Burglary (Drummond)
- 1 count of Armed Burglary (Deborah)
