At 2:40 pm the Hernando County Sheriff's Office received a call from BB&T Bank advising that a robbery had just occurred. The suspect was wearing long sleeves and gloves, and displayed a hand gun. A citizen observed the suspect run out of the bank to a nearby street and get into the passenger's side of a green four-door car with tinted windows. The alert citizen called 911 and began following the suspect vehicle. As deputies were closing in on the area of W. Linden Dr. and Spring Hill Dr. the suspect vehicle failed to stop at a stop sign causing a crash. One of the occupants in the other vehicle was transported to a local hospital with minor injuries.

After the crash both suspects exited the disabled vehicle and fled from the scene on foot. Deputies flooded the area and were able to immediately set up a tight perimeter after numerous 911 calls were received due to alert citizen's calling in suspicious subjects (the suspects) running through their yards. With the assistance numerous deputies (traffic units, warrants units, the air unit, and patrol units) both suspects were apprehended without further incident. The suspects were later identified as Nolan Ryan Wyles and Zachary John Rianhard. Both suspects were taken into custody at 2:55 pm.

FHP is working the vehicle crash.

“This is the second Hernando County bank robbery within a month where the suspects were apprehended within 15 minutes. Having adequate, dedicated and well trained deputies on the streets makes it very difficult to successfully commit a bank robbery in Hernando County,” said Sheriff Al Nienhuis.
