The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

A Silver Alert has been issued.

David Lee Sullivan was last seen on **09-22-18 at approximately 5:15 p.m.,** when he drove away from his residence in Brookridge (northwest Hernando County).

Mr. Sullivan was driving a **beige, 2013 Toyota Avalon, bearing Florida tag/CMDK57**.

Mr. Sullivan has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's. He has not driven a motor vehicle in several years.

Mr. Sullivan's physical description is as follows:

White Male Date of Birth – 07-01-1933 Height – 6'0'' Weight – 160 lbs. Hair – Bald (shaven) Eyes – Blue (wears glasses) Last seen wearing – POSSIBLE clothing description – blue jeans and a red polo shirt.

Mr. Sullivan has a medium size, mixed breed, brown (short haired) dog in the vehicle with him. It is unknown where Mr. Sullivan may be travelling to.

The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution.
