<u>SITUATION</u>

Hernando County Emergency Management is monitoring the development of Tropical Depression 9 in the extreme southwestern Gulf of Mexico. This system is expected to move west-northwest over the next few days before making a turn to the northeast, bringing excessive rainfall to Hernando County on Wednesday and Thursday. The National Hurricane Center is forecasting this depression to become a tropical storm over the next 24 hours.

POSSIBLE IMPACTS

4 to 6 inches of rain is forecast for Hernando County from Monday to Saturday. Isolated areas could possibly receive up to 8 inches of rain. There is potential for coastal and localized flooding. Tides may be up to 1 to 2 feet above normal levels on Wednesday and Thursday. Winds may reach 40 to 50 mph early Thursday morning. A storm surge of approximately 3 feet is also possible on Thursday afternoon, with higher amounts possible.

Two self-serve sandbag distribution sites will open on Tuesday at the following locations. Sand and sandbags will be available from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

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
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Hernando County Emergency Management will continue to monitor the situation. The EOC is not activated at this time. Shelters are not open at this time. Additional information will be released as it becomes available.
