TROPICAL STORM WARNING, FLOOD WATCH, AND HURRICANE WATCH REMAIN IN EFFECT FOR HERNANDO COUNTY.

<u>SITUATION</u>

- Tropical Storm Hermine continues to move toward the Florida peninsula. This system is currently moving north-northeast at 12 mph. Maximum sustained winds are 60 mph.
- The most significant impacts from Hermine are expected to occur this evening and last through the overnight hours into Friday morning.
- Hernando County is under a tropical storm warning and a hurricane watch. A tropical storm warning means sustained winds of 39 to 73 mph are expected due to a tropical storm within 36 hours. A hurricane watch is also in effect for Hernando County. A hurricane watch is issued when sustained winds of 74 mph or higher associated with a hurricane are possible within 48 hours.

POSSIBLE IMPACTS

- If you live on or near the coast, you will see flooding this evening and overnight. Residents in extreme low lying areas should consider evacuating to higher ground ahead of the storm. Significant rainfall and storm surge inundation are expected.
- High tide is scheduled to occur at 2:45 p.m. today, 3:19 a.m. Friday morning, and 3:21 p.m. Friday afternoon. The most significant of these will occur on Friday morning, with storm surge of 3 to 5 feet above high tide. Parts of Aripeka, Bayport, Hernando Beach, and Pine Island will experience flooding.
- Rainfall of 6 to 10 inches could produce flooding conditions, especially on roadways in other parts of the county.
- Sustained winds of 25 mph are expected, with wind gusts to 45 mph in rain bands. Secure personal property at this time.
- There is also increased potential for tornadoes today. Stay tuned to local media for the latest weather information. Be prepared to seek safe shelter.

- Do not drive into flood waters, "Turn Around, Don't Drown."
- Mariners should expect to see small craft advisories on Thursday and Friday.
