Initial Damage Assessment Information for Hernando County
September 5, 2016

Damage Assessment Teams conducted initial impact assessments throughout the county on Saturday, 09-03-16, and Sunday, 09-04-16. Information from the assessments will be provided to local and state officials to assist in recovery efforts.

Initial damage assessments are as follows:

The information above includes eight commercial structures. One business was assessed as destroyed.

The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, and remains accountable to them.
