Re: Meth Lab - 16362 Cherokee Road

Date: April 21, 2017

On 04-15-2017, Hernando County Sheriff's deputies responded to 16362 Cherokee Road in Brooksville regarding a possible meth lab. Deputies were notified of this after a family member residing at the residence discovered suspicious items on the property. Upon arrival, deputies were able to observe items consistent with the manufacturing of methamphetamine. The Vice and Narcotics Unit was requested to respond.

Detectives that are certified in methamphetamine lab investigations and dismantling of the lab responded to the scene. With the assistance of members of the Hernando County Fire Rescue Haz-Mat team, detectives were able to safely neutralize the lab and collect the various items without incident.

As a result of the investigation, detectives identified **Aaron Buckner W/M 09-20-1980** as the suspect. Detectives located Buckner on 04-20-2017 and placed him under arrest for the charges listed below:

## Aaron Buckner W/M 09-20-1980

- o Manufacturing of Methamphetamine
- Possession of a Structure for the Purpose of Manufacturing Methamphetamine
- o Possession of Methamphetamine
- o Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
- o Bond \$23,000.

## The Office of Sheriff:
