The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

A **Silver Alert** has been issued.

Thomas Edward Coghill Sr. was last seen on **08-11-17** at approximately 9:00 a.m., when he drove away from his residence on Pinehurst Drive, Spring Hill.

Mr. Coghill was driving **a red, 2000 Chevrolet Silverado extended cab truck, bearing Florida tag/702TDY**. The truck has a custom paint job on the hood featuring white leaves.

Mr. Coghill has been diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

Mr. Coghill's physical description is as follows:

White Male Date of Birth – 03-28-41 Height – 5'11'' Weight – 150 lbs. Hair – Salt and Pepper Eyes - Brown Last seen wearing – Black pants with a black and green polo shirt. He walks with a 4-prong cane.
