Re: Search Warrant - 10432 Clingman Street

Date: October 5, 2017

On 10-04-17, detectives with the Hernando County Sheriff's Office Vice and Narcotics Unit executed a search warrant at 10432 Clingman Street in Spring Hill.

The search warrant was the result of an ongoing investigation during which undercover detectives purchased illegal narcotics from the resident, Charles Graham.

Present in the residence with Graham was Jacquelyn Sibilla, who was charged with a minor offense and released on scene.

Illegal drugs seized from the residence included methamphetamine, hashish, marijuana, and various prescription medications along with paraphernalia. Also seized were firearms, ammunition, and cash.

Charles Graham W/M DOB 12-18-1966 was charged as follows:

- POSSESSION OF METHAMPHETAMINE (4 counts)
- PERSON POSSESSION PLACE/STRUCTURE/CONVE FOR SALE /TRAF/MANF CONTROL SUBSTANCE (3 counts)
- POSSESSION OF COCAINE
- POSSESSION OF A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE (2 counts)
- POSSESSION OF COCAINE
- POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA POSSESSION OF HASHISH
- POSSESSION DRUG PARAPHERNALIA (4 counts)
- BOND - \$77,000

The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, and remains accountable to them.
