Re: Vice and Narcotics Search Warrant – 27257 Osage Street

Date: January 3, 2018

On 01-03-18, detectives with the Hernando County Sheriff's Office Vice and Narcotics Unit, along with members of the Hernando County Sheriff's Office and Citrus County Sheriff's Office S.W.A.T. teams, executed a narcotics search warrant at 27257 Osage Street in Brooksville. The residence belongs to Donald Reyburn, a convicted felon. The Citrus County Sheriff's Office S.W.A.T. team was requested to assist Hernando County units based on the nature of the circumstances.

The investigation began several months ago when detectives received complaints of possible illegal activity occurring at the residence. During the investigation, detectives conducted undercover purchases of methamphetamine from Reyburn.

As a result of the search warrant, detectives located just over two ounces of methamphetamine (trafficking amount), numerous syringes, scales, methamphetamine pipes, and three firearms. One of the firearms had been reported as stolen, from a burglary that occurred in Spring Hill in 2017. Detectives also recovered a stolen camper trailer (from Marion County, FL) that was on the property as well as a vehicle that could be stolen (further investigation required). Detectives from District 1 responded to provide assistance and will be following up with charges regarding the stolen items.

Also located in the residence was Kenneth Mathis W/M 3-10-60, Krystal Jacobs W/F 9-25-85, and Stacey Hines W/F 5-29-79, all who were also arrested on various charges.
