Sheriff Al Nienhuis is pleased to announce that Captain Cyrus Robinson, Criminal Investigations Division Commander, recently graduated from the highly respected Florida Department of Law Enforcement's Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute, Executive Leadership Seminar, in Tallahassee. To date, only 100 law enforcement officers throughout the state have graduated from this program.

The Executive Leadership Seminar is an educational opportunity for command staff level managers of Florida criminal justice organizations. The seminar is delivered in three sessions, each emphasizing a different aspect of leadership. Topics include communicating through a crisis, critical thinking, leading people, managing organizations, overcoming adversity, emotional intelligence, and servant leadership. The courses are developed around law enforcement subjects and contemporary issues that are of interest to criminal justice professionals.

The Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute enjoys a reputation for excellence that would not be possible without the support of the Florida Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, resources made available by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, and guidance from Florida State University and the Florida Criminal Justice Executive Institute Policy Board.

"The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is a very large and complex organization. Command staff must make high-risk and far-reaching decisions on a daily basis. Although I have a very capable and dedicated command staff, it is important to ensure that they remain at the top of their game through law enforcement specific leadership training. The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, and remains accountable to them.
