Re: Deputies Negotiate with Barricaded Subject - Situation Ends Peacefully

Date: August 9, 2018

On o8-o8-18 at approximately 11 a.m., Hernando County deputies were dispatched to 59 West Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard in Brooksville regarding a Verbal Disturbance.

Upon arrival, deputies met with a female occupant of the residence, who was outside in the front yard. The female told deputies that Laurence Taliaferro, who is a family member and also a resident in the home, had been yelling at her all morning.

Deputies then attempted to make contact with Taliaferro, who was still inside the residence. Taliaferro screamed through the closed door that he had a gun and was not coming out. The deputies took cover and awaited the arrival of additional units.

While awaiting the arrival of additional units, the female advised the deputies that Taliaferro had access to a porch-like area, located on the roof of the carport. Within minutes, Taliaferro exited the residence and stood on the porch, armed with a shotgun.

Deputies (in tactical positions) ordered Taliaferro to come down from the patio. He refused, stating that he wanted to see them.

COPPS Deputy Roy McLaughlin arrived on scene and established a rapport with Taliaferro. After speaking with McLaughlin for only a few minutes, Taliaferro agreed to disarm himself. Taliaferro dropped the short-barrel shotgun and a large knife off the porch.

Once Taliaferro was disarmed, deputies removed the female from under the carport to waiting deputies.

Three deputies then entered the residence and placed Taliaferro in custody.

Laurence Taliaferro W/M DOB/02-28-1955 was arrested on scene and charged as follows:

- Felon in Possession of Firearm
- Felon in Possession of Ammunition
- Possession of Short Barrel Shotgun
- Bond \$25,000.

The Office of Sheriff:
