The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

A **Silver Alert** has been issued.

Paul Schneider was last seen on **05-28-18** at approximately 8 p.m., when he drove away from his residence on Krista Drive in Spring Hill on his way to The Home Depot on Commercial Way.

Mr. Schneider was driving a **beige, 2008 Honda CRV, bearing New Jersey tag/WTV48J**.

Mr. Schneider was recently diagnosed with Dementia. He also has high blood pressure and does not have access to his medication.

Mr. Schneider's physical description is as follows:

Weight – 200 lbs.

Hair – Grey hair

Eyes - Blue

Last seen wearing – Khaki shorts, a blue t-shirt and light blue sneakers.
