On 06-22-18 just before 4:30 p.m., a Hispanic male entered the Chase Bank located at 4279 Mariner Boulevard in Spring Hill. The male approached one of the tellers and passed a note that demanded money.

After a brief exchange with the teller, the Hispanic male suspect fled from the bank on foot. Once outside the bank, the suspect got into a maroon Mitsubishi Eclipse and fled the area.

**The suspect is described as follows:**

- Hispanic Male
- Dark hair – Short
- Short goatee
- In his 30s
- About 5'4" tall
- Black t-shirt with a white logo of a circle around the number 68 with the word "Serving" above the logo
- Light color baggy blue jeans
- Black shoes

No weapon was displayed during the robbery.
