The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT.**

A Silver Alert has been issued.

Colleen Blee was last seen on 10-23-18 at approximately 4 p.m., when she left the Brookridge subdivision in her vehicle. Family members spoke to her several hours later on the phone, however they did not know she was not at her residence when they were speaking to her.

Ms. Blee was driving a silver, 2010 Ford Escape, bearing Florida tag/4710PN.


Per family members, Ms. Blee has been diagnosed with Dementia.

Ms. Blee's physical description is as follows:

Weight – 150 lbs.
Hair – Gray
Eyes – Blue
Tattoos – R leg "My Husband Bob" and "My Son Trent"
Last seen wearing – Unknown clothing description.
