In years past, many people have been seriously wounded or killed by falling bullets on the 4th of July and New Year's Eve. Those tragic deaths and serious injuries, which resulted from stray bullets, continue to motivate Sheriff Nienhuis to remind citizens that stray bullets can injure or kill innocent bystanders.

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office maintains a zero tolerance stance on any and all illegal gun use and gun crime during the holiday. Please do your part to make the holiday a happy and safe one.

"There are many ways to safely celebrate with family and friends. Discharging a firearm is NOT one of them," said Sheriff Al Nienhuis. "It's just too easy for people to get hurt. Leave the firearms at home, in a safe and secure location."

The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
