Re:	Traffic Stop on a Scooter Leads to Trafficking in Methamphetamine Arrest
Date:	July 22, 2019

On 07-19-19 just after 11 p.m., Deputy Kevin Keiper was on proactive patrol in the area of Lakefront Road (Royal Highlands) when he spotted a male, who is known to him and does not have a valid driver's license, operating a motorized scooter.

Deputy Keiper conducted a Traffic Stop on the motorized scooter in the area of Nightwalker Road and Day Owl Avenue. The driver, James Hunt, was initially compliant with the deputy but soon decided to flee, on foot, from the Traffic Stop.

A foot pursuit ensued into a nearby wooded area where Deputy Keiper caught Hunt and escorted him to the ground. After a short struggle, Deputy Keiper gained control of Hunt and placed him into custody.

A search of Hunt's backpack revealed a clear, air-tight container which contained a clear, crystal-like substance, which later tested positive for methamphetamine. The total weight of the methamphetamine was 31.08 grams. Another air-tight container found in the backpack contained a scale, consistent with those used to weigh narcotics, and several small plastic baggies, commonly used to hold narcotics. It should be noted the scale contained residue that tested positive for methamphetamine.

James Hunt W/M DOB/07-29-1968 was found to have \$905 in cash on his person.

All items, including the cash, were seized.

Hunt was placed under arrest and charged as follows:

- Trafficking in Methamphetamine
- Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
- Driving While License Suspended or Revoked

- Resist w/o Violence
- Bond \$53,000

The Office of Sheriff:
