Detectives located **Bonnie Poulsen** early this morning in Pasco County. The Hernando County Sheriff's Office would like to thank the public for its assistance.

#### **Original Information**

**Bonnie Poulsen** was last seen on **08-26-19** at approximately 12:15 p.m., when she walked away from her residence located on Cedarfield Drive, in Ridge Manor.

The search for Ms. Poulsen is currently centered in the area of the Whispering Oaks subdivision in Ridge Manor.

Ms. Poulsen suffers from medical conditions that require immediate attention.
