Re: Armed Robbery - Dollar Tree - 19458 Cortez Boulevard-Brooksville

Date: October 25, 2019

On 10-24-19 just after 4 p.m., Hernando County Sheriff's deputies responded to the Dollar Tree located at 19458 Cortez Boulevard in Brooksville regarding an Armed Robbery.

The victim, a female who just exited another business, reported that she observed a suspicious white male loitering around her vehicle in the parking lot. When the victim approached her vehicle, she saw one of the windows broken out. At the same time, the male she had previously seen, approached with a firearm pointed at her and demanded her handbag. Once the suspect had the handbag, he got into a vehicle that was waiting nearby and fled the area.

Approximately 20 minutes later, a white female attempted to use the victim's stolen credit card to make a \$500 purchase at the Dollar General located at 34464 Cortez Boulevard in Brooksville. At the same time, a black male exits the passenger side of a silver vehicle in the parking lot. The silver vehicle is believed to be a secondary suspect vehicle.

The suspect vehicle in the Armed Robbery is described as a black, newer model, 4-door sedan with black wheels and tinted windows. The vehicle was driven by a black male.

The suspect in the Armed Robbery is described as a white male, approximately 40 years of age, 6 foot tall with a thin build. He had brown hair and was last seen wearing a grey shirt, blue jeans, and flip flops.

The white female (pictured) is the suspect who attempted to use the victim's stolen credit card.
