Re: Missing Endangered Adult - Wilfredo Velez Valentin

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT.** 

Wilfredo Velez Valentin left his residence in Spring Hill (area of Bayside Court and Ligonier Road) on foot just before 6 p.m. on 11-16-19.

Information obtained from surveillance cameras in the area reveals that Mr. Valentin walked west on Ligonier Road then turned north onto River Road.

Family members searched the general area for several hours before contacting law enforcement. Deputies have been on scene since approximately midnight and continue to search for Mr. Valentin, with the help of law enforcement canines.

As per family, Mr. Valentin suffers from dementia and takes medication for same.

### Wilfredo Velez Valentin's physical description is as follows:

White Male
Date of Birth – 02-28-31
Height – 5'5"
Weight – 127 lbs.
Hair – Grey (short)
Eyes – Brown

Last seen wearing – Black long-sleeve shirt, brown pants, and a tan baseball cap.
