The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is seeking assistance from the public in locating Missing Endangered JUVENILE, **Kaitlynn Apgar W/F DOB/10-24-2004.**

Kaitlynn Apgar was last seen on 03-01-2020 at approximately 8 a.m., at her residence just north of Brooksville. At some point after 8 a.m., Kaitlynn left the residence on foot, in an unknown direction of travel.

It is unknown what clothing Kaitlynn was wearing when she left her residence; however, she was wearing pink Converse sneakers and carrying a burgundy colored Van's backpack.

Kaitlynn left two notes in her bedroom indicating she may be considering self-harm.

Kaitlynn Apgar's physical description is as follows:

Height – 5'2" Weight – 130 Hair Color – Brown (straight – shoulder length) Eye Color – Blue Both ears pierced.

Deputies have been on scene for several hours attempting to locate Kaitlynn, meeting with negative results.

The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
