Michael McGarr was last seen on **03-04-20** at approximately 6 p.m., when he walked away from his residence located on Cedric Street, in Ridge Manor.

Mr. McGarr recently sustained a traumatic brain injury and suffers from memory loss. He did not take his cell phone with him when he left.

Last seen wearing – Gray shirt, blue jeans, dark brown boots, camouflage hat and glasses.
