The Hernando County Sheriff's Office received new information about the location of Missing Endangered Adult - Ronald Dean Boltz.

Mr. Boltz was spotted by a gas station clerk at around 3 a.m. on 06-13-2020 in Old Town, which is between Cross City and Chiefland.

The clerk said Mr. Boltz asked for directions to the Ohio/Michigan area. Mr. Boltz has family that lives in Ohio. The clerk added that Mr. Boltz appeared confused about where he wanted to go.

The clerk provided surveillance images of Mr. Boltz in the store.

Mr. Boltz suffers from numerous medical conditions to include the onset of dementia.
