UPDATE

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office has arrested two individuals in connection with the o6-21-2020 shooting on Lincoln Road in Brooksville.

Galvin Bernard Smith DOB/08-09-1975 was arrested Friday during a traffic stop on Deltona Boulevard.

Galvin Smith was charged with a **Weapon Offense** – **Missile into a Dwelling, Attempted Homicide** – **Attempted Murder in the First Degree (Premeditated),** and **Possession of a Weapon or Ammunition by a Convicted Felon.**

His bond was set at \$850,000 during First Appearance.

Gregory Lamont Smith DOB/07-25-1973 was arrested Monday during a traffic stop on Twigg Street in South Brooksville.

Gregory Smith, Galvin's brother, was charged with **Principle to Attempted Homicide** – **Murder in the First Degree (Premeditated)** and **Principle to Weapon Offense** – **Missile into a Dwelling**.

His bond was set at \$30,000 during First Appearance.

The victim in this case is expected to make a full recovery.

No additional details are available at this time.

Original Information

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is currently on the scene of a shooting in the area of Lincoln Road, in Brooksville.

One individual was shot during the incident.

The victim is being transported to an area trauma center for treatment of injuries.

The shooting does not appear to be random.

The suspect fled the area prior to law enforcement's arrival.

No additional details are available at this time.

The Office of Sheriff:

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
