Silver Alert

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

Rory Wilson was last seen at his residence on Candlelight Boulevard in the City of Brooksville at approximately 7 a.m., on 09-02-2020, when he left to "go run errands."

Mr. Wilson was driving a gray 2016 Toyota Corolla bearing Florida tag/024021.

As per family members, Mr. Wilson suffers from early onset dementia and Type 2 diabetes.

Mr. Wilson does have a cell phone with him; however, it is turned off.

Banking records indicate Mr. Wilson used his debit card at a Chevron station on north Broad Street in Brooksville shortly after 1 p.m. Deputies believe he may still be in Hernando County.
