Silver Alert

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

Stanley Braczynski was last in contact with a family member via telephone at 4 p.m. on 01-12-2021. Mr. Braczynski's was reported missing at 6:42 p.m. on 01-14-2021 after his family, who lives out of county, was unable to contact him.

Deputies responded to Mr. Braczynski's Spring Hill home where they found one of his vehicles missing from the residence.

Upon entering Mr. Braczynski's vehicle tag number into the system, deputies discovered it was captured on a highway camera in the Ocala area at 5 a.m. on 01-13-2021.

Mr. Braczynski suffers from numerous medical conditions, including dementia. Mr. Braczynski is driving a black 2013 Chevrolet Avalanche bearing Florida tag/522QNY.

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
