Re: Missing Endangered Adult - Nikilya Shavavea Davis

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

Nikilya Shavavea Davis was last seen at approximately 7 a.m. on 04-05-2021, when she was released from the Hernando County Detention Center.

Family members arranged for transportation (from the Detention Center) for Nikilya; however, Nikilya was gone when said transportation arrived to pick her up. It is believed Nikilya left on foot.

Nikilya suffers from a diminished mental capacity. She may be unable to adequately care for herself and/or make decisions that are in her best interest.

The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
