**Re:** Couple Apprehended Following Chase from Construction Site – 2022-29664

On 10-07-2022 at 1:45 a.m., Sgt. S. Johnson and Detective G. Garman were on proactive patrol when they observed a silver Hyundai Genesis in front of a construction site located at 12181 Topaz Street.

The driver of the vehicle, later identified as **Jeffrey Reardon DOB/10-03-1979**, was observed trespassing on the property prior to entering the vehicle and fleeing after being ordered by deputies to stop.

The vehicle was quickly located abandoned in the area of Cartee Avenue and Keysville Avenue in Spring Hill.

The HCSO Aviation and Drone units assisted in attempting to locate Reardon and a passenger in the vehicle, later identified as **Mailyne Billings DOB/03-28-1976**.

Deputies located Reardon and Billings a short time later.

While searching the suspects' vehicle deputies located numerous items taken during recent retail thefts from local businesses. During questioning both suspects confessed to committing numerous retail thefts.

Reardon was charged with **Resisting an Officer without Violence, Driving while License is Suspended or Revoked, Possession of a Controlled Substance without a Prescription, Trespassing, and Fleeing to Elude**. He was transported to the Hernando County Detention where he is being held in lieu of a \$10,000 bond.

Billings is charged with **Resisting an Officer without Violence**. Her bond was set at \$1,000.

Additional charges are pending further investigation.

## *The Office of Sheriff:*
