

PROTECTING YOUR PET



To protect your pet from dangerous diseases they could contract from the environment or other animals, the ASPCA® recommends vaccinating cats and dogs according to the schedule below. Your veterinarian may suggest additional vaccines based on your pet's risk of exposure.



**KITTENS

FVRCP • Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis • Calicivirus • Panleukopenia	2 months old	DA2PP • Canine distemper • Adenovirus 2 • Parvovirus • Parainfluenza
FVRCP Rabies* <i>*Required by state law</i>	3 months old	DA2PP Rabies* <i>*Required by state law</i>
FVRCP	4 months old	DA2PP
FVRCP Rabies* <i>*Ask your vet for a 3-year vaccine</i>	1 year later	DA2PP Rabies* <i>*Ask your vet for a 3-year vaccine</i>
FVRCP Rabies*	3 years later + every 3 years thereafter	DA2PP Rabies*

DOGS**

Have a pet over 4 months old with no history of vaccines?

- Unvaccinated dogs and cats 4 months of age and older should receive a DA2PP (dogs) or FVRCP (cats) and a rabies vaccine.
- After the initial set of vaccines, each vaccine should be given again 1 year later and then every 3 years* after that.

**Some vaccines are effective for only one year. Be sure to request 3-year vaccines from your veterinarian.*

Tip:

Bring your pet's vaccination records with you to the veterinarian to ensure they receive their vaccinations at the proper time.
