Purple Alert

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is requesting assistance from our media partners and the community in locating a **MISSING ENDANGERED ADULT**.

Christina Wall was last seen via doorbell camera footage on 07-06-2022 at 3:30 p.m. as she entered her vehicle and left her home on Olive Street in Brooksville.

A family member of Wall's became concerned when she was unable to reach Wall by phone. The family member proceeded to Wall's home where she found Wall had left her driver's license and cellular phone behind.

Ms. Wall suffers from numerous mental and cognitive disabilities.

She was last seen driving a silver 2012 Infinity G37 bearing Florida tag/2UBTRU.

Christina Wall's physical description is as follows:

As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
