Re: Juveniles Arrested for Burglary and Damage to Clubhouse – 2023-25439

Date: August 10, 2023

On 08-09-2023, at approximately 1:13 p.m., the Hernando County Sheriff's Office received a call stating two individuals had broken into a closed residential community clubhouse and were currently breaking windows and causing damage to the property.

A few minutes after the call was received, deputies arrived on scene and were able to observe two individuals moving around inside the building.

Within only 6 minutes, deputies had placed two male juveniles' individuals in custody.

The juveniles, later identified as 16-year-old **Kyler Whitacre**, **DOB/01-20-2007**, and 15-year-old, **Brandon Tecce**, **DO/11-07-2007**, were both arrested and charged with felony crimes as follows:

Kyler Whitacre

-Burglary of Dwelling or Structure Causing Damage Over \$1,000

Brandon Tecce

-Burglary of Unoccupied Structure, Unarmed

Both juveniles were transported to Hernando County Detention Center. Whitacre was later transferred to the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ). Tecce was later released into the custody of a parent.
