Re: Missing Endangered Adult – Florence Jean Tebo

The Hernando County Sheriff's Office is seeking assistance from the public in locating Missing Endangered Adult, **Florence Jean Tebo W/F DOB/06-19-1944.**

Ms. Tebo was last seen on Saturday at approximately 9 a.m. by a neighbor as she left her residence on Husek Street in Masaryktown. She was driving a white 2015 Chevrolet City Express Van, bearing Michigan tag DJK6100.

Tebo suffers from memory impairment and does not have her medication. She is believed to be traveling to Michigan. Family indicated Tebo does not like to drive at night or stay at hotels. Tebo may be at a rest stop, if she is traveling to Michigan.

Ms. Tebo was entered into the NCIC/FCIC as a Missing Endangered Adult.

Hair Color – Black
Eye Color – Brown

The Office of Sheriff:

The Office of the Sheriff is established by the Florida Constitution. As a constitutional officer, the Sheriff has the exclusive authority to administer his or her agency and is responsible for preserving the peace throughout the entire county, carrying out the laws of the state, the orders of Florida courts, and the ordinances of the Board of County Commissioners. The Sheriff is the chief law enforcement and correctional officer of the county.

Sheriff Al Nienhuis was initially appointed as the Sheriff of Hernando County by the Governor in January of 2011. He was then elected by the people of Hernando County in 2012, ran unopposed in 2016, and remains accountable to them.
