Re: SENTENCING UPDATE – Leonard Hall – Search Warrant Leads to Multiple
Arrests in Narcotics Investigation – 2024-238642

Date: March 11, 2025

On 03-11-2025, **Leonard Hall DOB/09-22-1974**, appeared in circuit court where the judge sentenced Hall to nine years with the Florida Department of Corrections, after being convicted for his role in multiple narcotics trafficking transactions involving fentanyl-pressed pills.

Each of Hall's transactions, conducted throughout 2024, involved quantities of fentanyl that exceeded state trafficking thresholds.

Hall's arrest on 09-03-2024, marked the conclusion of an extensive investigation led by the Hernando County Sheriff's Office Vice and Narcotics Unit. The investigation revealed that Hall had been actively involved in the distribution of fentanyl, a powerful and highly dangerous synthetic opioid responsible for countless overdoses and deaths nationwide.

During the investigation, it was presented that Hall's narcotics transactions had not only violated state drug laws but also contributed to the ongoing opioid crisis in the region.

This sentence sends a clear message that those who traffic in deadly substances, like fentanyl, will face significant consequences. The opioid epidemic continues to devastate communities, and we are committed to taking dangerous criminals like Hall off the streets.

Hall's activities were part of an alarming trend in Hernando County and across Florida, where fentanyl trafficking has led to a rise in overdose deaths. Law enforcement agencies, working together, have made significant strides in disrupting such operations and holding offenders accountable.

Original information

After an extensive months-long investigation, the Hernando County Sheriff's Office Vice and Narcotics Unit successfully executed a search warrant at 3289 Morven Drive in Spring Hill, resulting in the arrest of two individuals involved in the distribution of illegal narcotics.

On September 3, 2024, Leonard Hall and Heidi Williams were apprehended following a traffic stop. Both individuals had been under investigation for several months, during which time detectives made multiple purchases of pressed fentanyl pills, which were disguised as oxycodone. Each purchase involved a trafficking amount of fentanyl.

During the traffic stop, Heidi Williams was found to be in possession of crack cocaine, which she had concealed in a body cavity. This discovery led to the subsequent execution of a search warrant at the residence on Morven Drive.

A search of the residence revealed the following items:

- Cocaine
- Fentanyl
- Hashish.

The following individuals were placed under arrest and charged as follows:

 - o Possession of a Controlled Substance w/Intent to Sell
 - o Unlawful Use of a Two-Way Communication Device
 - o Possession of a Conveyance w/Intent to Sell a Controlled Substance
 - o Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
 - o Possession of Cocaine (charge from traffic stop)
 - o Possession of Fentanyl (charge from traffic stop)
 - o Bond - \$249,000
 - o *Leonard Hall is currently on probation out of Pennsylvania for Sale and Possession of Cocaine.*

- Heidi Williams DOB/07-23-1981

- Trafficking in Fentanyl (2 counts)
 - Possession of a Controlled Substance w/Intent to Sell
 - Possession of a Conveyance w/Intent to Sell a Controlled Substance
 - Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
 - Possession of Crack Cocaine (charge from traffic stop)
 - Possession of Drug Paraphernalia (charge from traffic stop)
 - Tampering with Evidence (charge from traffic stop)
 - Bond - \$100,000.
- Isaiah Williams DOB/01-21-2003
- Possession of Hashish
 - Bond - \$5,000.
